“Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.”
Ephesians 6:4

One of our primary responsibilities as parents is to raise our children in a way that will honor God. This requires consistently teaching them not to focus on material or worldly success, but to walk in the way the Lord has instructed.

Many Christian parents provide intentional Biblical instruction in their homes and are involved in their local churches. They take great care to make sure their children are involved in vibrant children’s and youth ministries, but have those parents considered the powerful influence of their children’s school and teachers? Although the primary responsibility of raising children to follow Christ lies with Dad and Mom at home, whoever we place our students under, is an important aspect to consider. Sending our children to Christian school becomes an extension of our home and church where the teachers partner with parents in training our children to love and serve Jesus.

The average child spends between more than 15,000 hours in school from the day they enter kindergarten until they graduate from high school. This does not include time spent outside of class in athletic practices, rehearsals, or other extra-curricular activities.

Children spend 40% of their waking hours in school—ten times more than they do in church. And if they are in a school without a Biblical Worldview, that’s 15,000 hours of consistently not learning the importance of God, while reinforcing that the answers to life are not found in Him but in human pursuits. If we give our children training and instruction that intentionally excludes God’s Word during the most formative period of their lives, can we honestly say we have brought up our children in the instruction “of the Lord?”

At GCA, we raise our students to be Christian scholars who follow Christ with their whole heart. They are spending their 15,000 hours being trained and shaped by Christian teachers who are equipping them with the tools needed to evaluate their world through the lens of Christian values. Christian education means building upon, not challenging or tearing down, the values and beliefs you hold in your own Christ-centered homes.

Students at GCA learn these values not just from chapels and Bible classes, but also from the examples that are modeled and taught by faculty, coaches, and staff members in every school activity. Christian education seeks to teach children about the world God created and how our faith is woven into each aspect of living. We believe that through a proper understanding of God, we can know truth and show His love by serving those around us.

Bible Class

In **Kindergarten**, learning the history (and future history) in the Bible is our favorite class, not because of what we do as we learn it, but because the heart of a child is so very close to God and they love, love, love thinking about their friend Jesus! Using the Bible, the ACSI Bible Curriculum, Superbook videos, Answers in Genesis, making music, crafts, and prayer, we explore what God has done and what God will do. We talk about facts, meanings, and what the world may say versus what we know is Truth! And we sing--A LOT--which is one of our favorite things to do! We have many songs that we love, but one of the most fun is about the Armor of God. It is not only a super cute song, but something we come back to over and over when we talk about preparing ourselves to face the world. We work to remember the tools God equipped us with and to gain an understanding of how each helps us! Since Kindergarten is when we learn to read, and we learn to read so that we can read the Bible, we also use the verses we read and the songs we learn to remember to hide God's Word in our hearts. Who's got their armor on? We've got our armor on! Piece by piece we put it on!

First Grade does a combination of chapel on Fridays with Pastor Gary, a lesson time each Monday with our H.S. Bible team, and our own class study of various people in the Bible. On Fridays, we meet with Kindergarten through second grade students in the Fireside Room and sing songs and have a Bible message delivered by Pastor Gary. This lesson is followed up with our H.S. Bible leaders on Mondays. The kids go over the lesson; they are asked questions, play games, watch a short video about the lesson, and then are challenged to memorize a new Bible verse each week. In class, we will sometimes continue with the same lesson and sometimes we will learn about another event in the Bible. We often have a Bible craft to go along with our lessons. The kids work on their memorization skills, and their favorite thing to do is to watch the SuperBook series that goes along with our lessons!

One of the most exciting differences between my time at GCA and in public school is the opportunity to relate all things to Biblical truths. Bible is absolutely a "class" for **Second Grade** daily, and I am able to base our class rules and expectations, conflict resolution, and how we "do life" on Scripture. Our Bible curriculum first semester rests very heavily in the Old Testament following the Israelite people in sequential order from Abraham to Moses then on to Joshua. We look fairly thoroughly at each of these leaders and the struggles they faced, but what I enjoy most about this curriculum is the relation of the Scriptures to how the kids can use them today. Between Christmas and Easter, we look at the miracles Jesus performed while on Earth. Student's

have a weekly memory verse that aligns with our lessons. In my opinion, memory verses have lifelong effects. Students can hide those words in their heart for when they need them and will know where to turn when they need help.




Teaching Bible to **Fourth Grade** and **Fifth Grade** is the highlight of my day!! What a blessing to have the opportunity to help them draw closer to our Savior!! They are now at an age where we can dig a little deeper into some things and talk about how we can apply God's Word to our everyday lives. It is so awesome to help them see that God's Word is not just for "older people," but God walks along them, too, each and every day. We talk about some passages in the Bible that they are already familiar with as well as introducing them to some new parts of the Bible they may not have heard before.

Grade 4 has a strong focus on forgiveness and Salvation. Grade 5 learns the path of the Israelites through Moses, Joshua, as well as people like David, Deborah and Gideon. It is so exciting to help Bible history come to life!! Both grades memorize a verse from the Bible each week. They love the Bible Verse Challenges we do each week where we play games to try to get those verses memorized, which is a great way to study and keep some of God's Word tucked in their hearts! We also try to include other ways to see/hear God's word by listening to music of various contemporary Christian artists as well as some videos. The students love to talk about the lyrics and are quick to come back and tell me when they have heard the songs somewhere else. I have heard on many occasion how these songs have lead to discussions at home. I love it!! In 5th grade, after we learn about a person in the Bible, read Bible passages, discuss, do book assignments, then we will compare to the beloved Veggie Tales version. For both grades, we try to inspire ways to spread God's Word to others. They like to come up with ways to send encouragement to the younger elementary students, GCA staff, and, in some cases, the whole school. Both grades love to find ways to be encouragers...to help us all keep our eyes on Christ!! Something I pray they will do throughout their time at GCA and beyond!!

Sixth Grade Bible class has been using a text called Route 66 for several years. The goal is to travel from Genesis to Revelation throughout the whole school year, covering a brief overview of each of the 66 books in roughly a two- to three-day window. I think it's beneficial to see the over-arching theme in Scripture throughout each and everyone of God's inspired books: knowing it is always about His glorious praise through His Son's ultimate sacrifice - the Messiah!! This message is continuously ex-pressed, observed, and sought after throughout the Bible.

One of several activities we do in addition to the text is a Bible character sketch illustrating one particular Bible character--how he or she did or didn't come to know the Lord personally--how he or she did or didn't walk in obedience--how he or she viewed God's sovereign commanding place in their life--and how we NOW can glean from this experience to walk humbly and fear the Lord in reverence and respect.

Preparing students for the future outside of GCA is the ultimate expectation and to take the spiritual aspect of their lives is an even greater privilege and responsibility. Once again I believe seeing a uniform theme and message across the Bible: Yeshua, who is Jesus the Messiah, has been--is--and will always be the main character in the Scriptures! Additionally, they see the brokenness, the sinfulness, and the deception that historical Bible figures were a part of...and yet the Redemption and Restoration that God has always continuously offered!! This is in many ways similar to the story of each of our lives:



(continued) We, sinners by choice yet saved by grace, can be Overcomers, too, by the blood of the lamb and the word of our testimony in Him!

The six grade Bible class also has a weekly memory verse that parallels the book or the books we've been studying that week. How do you keep a young man pure according to God's Word? By hiding God's Word in our heart that we would not sin against him.

In **Seventh Grade** Bible Class, we use the first nineteen chapters of the book, 30 Days to Understanding the Bible by Max Anders. The purpose of the book/class is to give the students a complete overview of the entire Bible. We look at how the Bible is structured, all the major events, the major points of geography, and we also learn about many significant men and women.

The students memorize the different Eras – Creation, Patriarch, Exodus, Conquest, Judges, Kingdom, Exile, Return, Silence, Gospel, Church, and Missions, which gives them an understanding of the chronology of Bible events. Many students are familiar with several Bible stories. The goal is to help them understand where all of these stories fit into the big picture of the Bible. Additionally, we do a lot of reading the Bible in class. Many students are surprised to find that some of the facts they've seen in the Veggie Tales movies aren't actually in the Bible.

Lastly, we spend much time throughout the year lifting one another up in prayer, attending weekly Chapel services, sharing favorite Bible verses, discussing how to pray, learning how to lead a person to Christ, and discussing questions that the students bring up in class.

I love having the opportunity to teach the Bible, and I especially enjoy getting to know the students on a more personal level. I've had many of the students through the years in music class, but it is such a blessing to connect with them daily through prayer and Bible study. In **Eighth Grade** Bible Class, we seek to acquaint students personally with Jesus, the Messiah of God as an academic curriculum and a devotional study. The Life of Christ presents both factual content and personal application materials.

Students will complete this course with an introductory understanding of Christ's identity, ministry, and doctrine through a series of 35 lessons focused on the Book of John. Students also participate in group presentations, student-led devotions, chapel, small group study, memory verse work, verse application, and other various projects throughout the year. Teaching the Word has been one of the most rewarding and blessed experiences I have had as a teacher. Seeing the students everyday of the week is an absolute JOY!

A statement that we hear all the time is "The youth is the future of the church." Although this is true and accurate, it is only to an extent. The youth is not only the future of the church, but they are the "church right now." That means, they have a role to play in the Kingdom of God at this very moment. If we only say that the youth is "the future of the church", then we have to ask ourselves, "When does the 'future' begin?" Is it after they graduate from high school? Is it after they complete a higher level of education, whether college or trade? The answer is pretty broad. The reality is, the youth are not just the future, but the present. Even Jesus used children as examples to adults of what it looks like to enter the Kingdom of God (Matthew 18:3-4; Luke 18:16-17). The primary purpose of High School Bible class at Granville Christian Academy, is not only to prepare students to be active members of God's Kingdom in the future, but to equip them for how to be active participants in the Kingdom of God right now. This is accomplished across the 9-12th grade curriculum.

In **High School** Bible Class, freshmen are taught the foundations of faith such as, but not limited to, "What is Truth?", "What is Real?" and "What is the Bible?" Basic apologetics are introduced in the 9th grade curriculum. Sophomores focus on the Life of Christ, learning about His divinity, humanity, His Messiahship, and return, which leads into Spiritual Formation in how we are to grow in our relationship with Jesus and be imitators of Him. The Juniors and Seniors are focused on core doctrines of the faith such as "Who is Jesus?", "The Trinity", and the "Bible as the Word of God." There are plenty of lessons, discussions, and in class activities that accompany what is taught in class. The core of Bible class is allowing the Holy Spirit to reveal the truth of His Word and of Jesus Christ to the students and to empower them to live as the "Imago Dei" of God (image of God) as they walk in their calling of being the present, active members of God's Kingdom.

Elementary Chapel here at GCA has been broken into two teams: the first group consisting of kindergarten through second grade, and the second group consisting of third grade through fifth grade. Both groups meet in the fireside room on a weekly basis each Friday morning. As the year began, we had Chapel from a zoom perspective—then we began Chapel from a large group perspective spread out in the worship center—and now we’re doing Chapel on a smaller scale in the fireside room. It has been good. Every aspect has offered new opportunities to engage in ways that were more creative and yet worshipful and Christ honoring!

Our weekly chapels follow an over-arching theme—we began the year with Bible heroes from the Old Testament and went through a

series of Biblical characters from Genesis, Exodus, and First and Second Samuel. Now, here in the second half of the year, we’ve progressed over to the New Testament and are teaching from the Book of Acts, the disciples and followers of Christ in the early church, and how our Lord God empowered them with His Holy Spirit and sent them forth on Mission both to know Christ and to make him known! It’s been a great delight to work with the students using these particular texts. My favorite part of weekly Chapel is the students—the energy, the effort, and the conscientious respect they have toward the Word of God—Praise to the Lord Jesus—and to know they play a part in His overall plan (made in His image and designed for His glory—they are so precious)!!

It would be our desire that each and every student and accompanying teacher will have a **PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP** with Jesus Christ: Develop spiritually in the likeness of Christ -conforming to His Imagery; hiding the Word of God in their heart that they might not sin against Him; letting their identity be in a personal relationship with Jesus.

We do have guests that come in for Chapel. One would be Pastor Dave Mason of the Heath Church of Christ. Pastor Dave comes in monthly to lead special worship and praise. Pastor Dave has been joining us in Chapel for well over ten years! It’s a great joy to partner with Pastor Dave, and the students love His enthusiasm, his encouragement, and his Christ-likeness greatly!!

Leading and being a part of elementary Chapel at GCA has always been one of my greatest delights and true privileges. I thank God for the chance to share His truth and to create an environment of genuine Love & Affirmation for our students. To see the excitement of His children worshipping together has always been a joy of my heart!!

Middle School and High School Chapel Chapel this year has been a journey through the book of Daniel. We begin with full group Chapel each week, then the following week we go into small groups to discuss what's been taught. Chapel Small Groups provides a chance for the students to really dig deeper into the application of the Word. Daniel and his Hebrew companions were taken as teens to Babylon and forced to go through a re-education process. The Babylonians believed that if you can "change the way of thinking you can change the man." Even though they faced many cultural challenges and threats, they refused to give in and Daniel 1 says he: resolved that he would not defile himself. Daniel wasn't disrespectful or antagonistic, he simply lived faithfully and even in Daniel 6 it says that Daniel "became distinguished above all the other high officials...because an excellent spirit was in him." Our latest Chapel focused on living by our values. If we say that we value something then that "something" should shape our decisions, our thoughts, and our goals. Our hope is that "something" is a "someone" namely, Jesus Christ. If our lives are lived by the values of Christ, then the decision to not bow down, the decision not to eat food offered to idols, our decision to keep praying even when it's been outlawed is an easy one. This means for us in 2021 that we all the other pursuits we have with grades, sports, jobs, are all INFORMED by our faith, not inconvenienced by our faith.

Family Groups is a class at GCA that is composed of ten to fourteen high school students who elect to participate as in-class instructors, mentors, and teachers for kindergarten through fifth grade students. We meet Tuesday through Friday as a class to prepare a lesson plan and template which they will teach in class among elementary students on the following Monday. One of the primary roles that family group high school students play is as a mentor. They get to know their elementary partners quite well and on a first name basis. Spending weekly time in their classroom, they challenge the elementary students with a biblical message, a weekly memory verse, and with a weekly application of how God's Word can impact their lives every day. Seeing these HS students execute and teach their weekly lesson has to be our favorite experience! Sharing prayer, reviewing lessons from previous weeks, hearing testimonies of students that have sought to apply God's Word, and seeing the enlightenment in their engagement, and praying as they go and going as they pray is a true joy. Once again, we, as a high school class, select Scriptures that parallel our weekly Chapel messages. For example, if we're teaching through the Bible heroes of the Old Testament, we will glean from that context how to devise a lesson plan of 30 minutes. These compliment our weekly Chapel messages with small group discussion and ultimate application. GCA has some of the best students in the world, and it's an honor to walk alongside our high school students in family groups who feel called to lead their younger peers on the greatest journey of life—knowing Jesus personally!!
