



# Thanksgiving Baskets



On the last day before Thanksgiving Break, our High School National Honor Society organized the filling of the Thanksgiving Baskets for our joint service project with Spring Hills Baptist Church. Thanksgiving baskets is an annual project for GCA that provides our students and families the opportunity to personally connect with those in need in our community. Our elementary students wrote notes for each family and all of our students, grades K-12, contributed grocery items such as stuffing, green beans, and mashed potatoes that were needed to fill the 120 baskets that would be delivered to members of our community in need.

Our middle school students then took the items and filled each basket for the high school students to personally deliver to each family in the afternoon. The elementary students wrote individual notes to be put into each basket. They then came down to the worship center by class where they prayed over the baskets and for the families who would receive them. Mrs. Rizor and the art classes wrote Scripture around the rims of each basket and created artwork to be put into each one. As the high school students delivered the baskets, they were able to talk and pray with each of the families, sharing the love of Christ with them.

We cannot thank you, the GCA community, enough for your donation of items to fill these baskets and the greater needs of others for Thanksgiving.



Each year, GCA students in grades K-12 have the opportunity to help with Operation Christmas Child, a service project through Samaritan's Purse where shoeboxes are packed and shipped to countries across the world for the sole purpose of sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The national collection week took place in November where Spring Hills Baptist served as a local collection center for churches, schools, families and organizations throughout Licking County. Our classes at GCA set their own goal to provide items to make boxes for a certain gender and age. After the items were brought in, Pastor Gary hosted a "Packing Party" right before Thanksgiving break with our elementary students where the students were able to assemble the boxes themselves. They prayed over each box: for the children who will be receiving not only the gifts inside, but the message of Jesus's death and our salvation--that they may accept Him into their hearts as their Lord and Savior.





Every box has a divine appointment. We have had special Chapel speakers and guests over the years who were recipients of the shoeboxes in other countries and are now in ministry as missionaries and pastors. Operation Christmas Child partners with the local churches in each of those remote areas, and those local churches are the ones that personally deliver the boxes. As they do so, they share the Gospel with the children in their own villages. The most beautiful part is the relationship this builds between

the children and the churches, opening the doors for those children to return to them over and over. The middle school students helped load 2,714 completed boxes this year onto a semi truck that shipped them to Charlotte, North Carolina, the next day. Charlotte is one of six processing centers in the U.S. and it is the largest in both the size and in its production. Our Senior and Junior students annually make the trip to Charlotte to help process the shoeboxes with other volunteers during the first week of December.



Our Varsity Cheerleaders, Boys Basketball, and Girls Basketball teams gathered together to pack Operation Christmas Child boxes before Thanksgiving Break.



Our Junior and Senior classes just returned from an amazing trip to Charlotte, North Carolina to participate in Operation Christmas Child. They served for four days in the largest center in the U.S. that checks, packs, and ships all of the green and red Operation Christmas Child boxes from across the country. Our students were on their feet for several hours with each shift they served by working at stations that checked each box. Of the thousands of boxes that they sorted they checked each box for approved items, filled them with additional items, taped them, and then sorted them by age and gender. The individual boxes were packaged together into larger shipping containers where they were immediately loaded into semi-trailers to be sent to various destinations around the world.



Each station in the center that our GCA students worked at processed approximately 2,400 boxes each day. Our group occupied at least six to seven stations each day and 24 throughout the trip. These stations are the last individuals to touch and pray over each one of those boxes before they reach the hands of the children who will be blessed by them. It was an incredible opportunity for each of the students and our school community was so excited to see them be able to return to such an important aspect of our school ministry.


As part of the mission of GCA in training servant leaders, the group not only served at OCC, but also at the local food pantry "Loves and Fishes". Student's also also took time to go shopping for the "Roof Above" ministry. This organization helps individuals transition into an apartment after spending time homeless. Our students purchased \$1,000 worth of supplies for the two apartments while also gaining some valuable experiences during the process.

It was an incredible week for our students that was both humbling and inspiring. Our GCA students served with their whole hearts throughout their time, in Charlotte.


## Winter Sports Program


